



Karen B. London, Ph.D. received her B.S. in Biology from UCLA and her Doctorate in Zoology from the University of Wisconsin. Her research and scholarly publications cover such diverse topics as interactions between species that live together, defensive and aggressive behavior, evolution of social behavior, communication within and between species, learning, and parental investment.

Dr. London is a Certified Applied Animal Behaviorist and a Certified Pet Dog Trainer whose clinical work focuses on the evaluation and treatment of serious behavioral problems in dogs. Dr. London was trained by Dr. Patricia McConnell and worked with her for four years as a Behaviorist and Trainer before moving to New Hampshire to turn her long-distance marriage into a short-distance one. She then worked as the Certified Applied Animal Behaviorist and taught training classes at the Upper Valley Humane Society.

Karen London is currently a columnist for *The BARK* Magazine and served for three years on the Animal Behavior Society's Board of Professional Certification. Dr. London is the author (with Patricia B. McConnell, Ph.D.) of *Feisty Fido: Help for the Leash-Aggressive Dog*, *Feeling Outnumbered: How to Manage and Enjoy your Multi-Dog Household*, and *Way to Go! How to Housetrain a Dog of Any Age*. She has written widely about training and behavior as well as giving educational seminars and speeches on canine behavior for trainers, veterinary and shelter staff, and the public. Dr. London is a lecturer at Northern Arizona University for Tropical Forest Insect Ecology, a field course that goes to Nicaragua, and has given guest lectures in Animal Behavior at several colleges. She is working on her next book, which will also be co-authored with Patricia McConnell, called *Play Together, Stay Together*. She lives in Flagstaff, Arizona with her husband and their two young sons.
